THIS FORMIDABLE PAIR —

Should indeed be regarded as a pair, even though they have had separate careers, and there is a twenty-year age gap between them — BEAKER b. 1918, FENELLA b. 1938.

BEAKER

In 2005 there appears to be an excellent CV of Dr. HORATIO BEAKER provided by Professor Tate and based on work by Martin Hutchinson. It is no fault of anyone's that it is incomplete and that some of its facts are inaccurate; Dr. Beaker's own memory is imperfect in places and hard facts about his career are extremely hard to come by, with the result that several of those who have tried to document them — (*including myself, MW*) have later found errors in what they have collated.

BEAKER'S BUREAU

1958 HKW (Hugh) can attest to having seen BEAKER operating from a large outdoor caravan trailer located in a White City (W. London) car park. At this time, HKW wrote **Beaker's Bureau** up as potential programming for the media. As it happened, DR BEAKER was at the same time assisting MCW with the design of LETTUCE, in Cambridge, quite unaware that Hugh and myself were in fact brothers.

But by 1959 BBC TV had bought the car park site and was building Television Centre on it. Beaker had moved on, and when next we got in touch with him he had already set **Beaker's Bureau** up in Wester Ross, Scotland.
